- Discussion on the current software program used by animal control. Myers indicated that current program appears to be outdated and would like to look for a more efficient system.
- Carter discussed the hours of the animal control shelter and thought that it would be more public friendly to be open on Saturdays. He felt that one employee could work Monday thru Friday and the other employee could work Tuesday thru Saturday. After discussion, the animal control shelter will be open 6 days a week for the month of July to see if makes a difference for the public. Donny will set the schedule for himself and staff member.
- Monthly reports submitted for EMA and Animal Control.
- Myers gave committee members an updated price list for animal control shelter services from Timbercrest. The county could use Timbercrest as a backup to Dr. Baker.
- Motion by Myers, 2nd by Newberg to adjourn at 7:24 a.m. Voice vote, motion carried.

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SHELTER PRICING

Pricing is per animal

Feline Neuter - \$78 w/ pain medication ~\$97

Feline Spay - \$98.40 w/ pain medication ~\$120

Feline vaccines (Rabies & FVRCP) - \$40.80 with single visit charge - \$72

K9 Neuter - \$127.20 w/ pain medication ~\$145

K9 Spay - \$161 w/ pain medications ~\$175

K9 Vaccines (Rabies & Distemper) - \$51.20 with single visit charge - \$ \$82.40

Exam charges will be subject to change depending on what the Doctor is doing, if there is more than one pet the Doctor is seeing at a time a "Litter" price would be charged. Exam charge would be anywhere from \$31 - \$60 depending on services.

Travel Charge would be \$67.20

K9 Distemper - \$32

FVRCP - \$21.60

Rabies vaccine charge - \$19.20

Blood Draw – if we were seeing the pet for other services there would NOT be a blood draw charge. If we are only seeing the pet for blood draw specifically it would be \$13.60
